ND AHEC Scholars

AHEC Scholars is a nationally recognized certification program that complements existing coursework to emphasize a team-based approach with interdisciplinary curricula implementing a defined set of clinical, didactic, and community-based activities for healthcare in rural and/or underserved areas.



Eligibility Criteria:

- Have an interest rural and/or underserved areas
- Currently enrolled in a health profession degree
- Be two years from degree completion (one year options available with prior approval)

Requirements Each Year:

- 40 hours of community-based, experiential, or clinical training
- 40 hours of didactic education focused on 8 core topic areas listed below
- Eligible to receive \$500 (\$1000 total) upon completion of requirements
