## WHY CHOOSE A MASTER OF PUBLIC HEALTH AT NDSU?

- » The NDSU MPH program offers flexibility to complete coursework in person or online.
- » Classes are small, ranging from 10-25 students, allowing for close collaboration with faculty and individual attention students won't find elsewhere.
- » The program is CEPH accredited, meeting rigorous national standards for public health training.







## WHAT'S REQUIRED TO APPLY TO THE NDSU MPH PROGRAM?

- » Applicants must have a 3.0 GPA or higher.
- » Applicants are required to hold a bachelor's degree from an accredited university, transcripts, two letters of recommendation, a personal statement and English proficiency scores (if applicable).

### HOW LONG WILL IT TAKE TO COMPLETE THE MPH PROGRAM?

» An MPH degree can be earned through full-time or part-time study. Full-time students can complete the 42-credit program in two years. Part-time students can complete the program in three to five years.

#### WHEN CAN I START THE MPH PROGRAM?

» Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis throughout the year. Students may be admitted and start in the fall, spring or summer. Application deadlines vary by term.
