(Palliative Care Clinical Nurse Specialist). Please consider having a representative from each of the following departments or programs, complete the survey: in-patient and/or out-patient palliative care programs, cardiac rehabilitation, cancer care, kidney dialysis/diabetic care, respiratory care or pain management, if your organization provides one or more of these services.

The survey will take approximately 10 to 15 minutes to complete. As a respondent organization for this survey, you will have the ability to identify your organization's interest in receiving and sharing information related to palliative care with other organizations that are also engaged in this type of patient care.

Aggregated state and regional level survey results will be posted on the Honoring Choices website later this year and made available to your organization and other North Dakota stakeholders. A fact sheet with a summary of the results will also be made available on the Honoring Choices website. Notification will be sent out electronically via newsletter or by direct contact when the results are available and how to access them. The North Dakota Palliative Care workgroup, in conjunction with other organizations, will be developing a plan of action to address identified needs and gaps when the survey results are compiled.
